Sportsman
Civic Leader

BOB PECK has been involved in the Arlington County sports scene for over fifty years. His enthusiasm for sports developed on the field of play, as a participant in his early years, and remains to this day as an active golfer. But Bob's main impact on sports has been and continues to be his sponsorship of community youth activities. Since 1939, his steadfast support of youth has brought him many accolades, including 1967 Arlington Sportsman of the Year.

As a civic leader Bob has served the Arlington community with distinction, first as an elected member (1952) of the County Board (serving as Chairman in 1953); active in the Arlington County Chamber of Commerce, serving as president in 1956; and member of the Arlington County School Board 1958-61, serving as chairman two years.



JOHN RANDOLPH
Athlete/Coach
Athletic Director, W & M
Athletic Hall of Fame (1978)

JOHN RANDOLPH is a 1960 graduate of Washington Lee High School where as an athlete he excelled in indoor & outdoor track and cross country. John continued his track career at the College of William & Mary running the 220, 440 and 880 events. After serving as a captain the Marine Corps., John returned to his alma mater in 1967 to begin his distinguished coaching career capturing many Southern Conference and Virginia State championships. He became track coach at West Point in 1976, where his teams compiled a record of 54-4 in three years. For the next six years he headed the track program at the University of Florida during which time he also served as chairman of the U.S. Men's Olympic Development Committee, the group that prepared track and field athletes for the 1984 Olympic games. John has served as Director of Athletics at the College of William & Mary since being appointed to that post in 1985.
